

**FORM TJ-126. Table for Civil Jury Instructions.
See Appendix “B” to the JSR.**

NOTE: Instruction Series 100 through 499 are only examples of the California Civil Jury Introductory Instructions which have universal applicability. We need to set up our own Civil Jury Instructions. Most of these instructions may be adaptable for Philippine Civil Jury (Introductory) Instructions and some may not be which can be viewed only as an advisory for Philippine lawyers and judges and for future studies to update or improve the Philippine Civil Jury Systems.

Those instructions that are applicable to the Philippine Jury will need to be tied in with Philippine Laws, Decrees, Rules, Jurisprudence or established legal doctrines and have to be indicated under the “Authority” caption after each specific instruction.

The citation of authority needs to be improved by more knowledgeable Philippine legal scholars and authorities under guidance by the Philippine Supreme Court. The California Civil Jury Instruction which is briefly known as “CalCrim”, an up-dated version of “Calcic” the former principal California civil jury instructions, may be browsed at:
